As you are aware, we recently surveyed our customers to get their opinions on our policy of not printing booklets with liner notes in an attempt to minimize the use of paper. The results were surprising to me, but definite. Effective immediately we will start again printing booklets with our CD releases.

Our new releases - "*Sonatas for Baroque Guitar*" by Richard Savino and "*Adio España*" by the Baltimore Consort will be released in the eco-paks, however they have the notes included, printed on the packaging. The only information that would have to be downloaded are the Spanish texts for the new Baltimore Consort release.

All album notes will continue to appear online on our website for use by the public-at-large free of charge, and for those who have chosen to download the albums from one of our digital distribution partners.

While our first priority is your satisfaction, we will continue to seek out the most environmentally sound packaging for our products. We urge everyone to look at options in packaging and to let us know when you see something that you like that is environmentally sound. At this time, we are reviewing our options for our upcoming releases, from all-cardboard products with booklets printed on recycled paper, to Digipaks with trays made from recycled plastic. Like with the standard eco-paks, the cost on these options will be higher than a standard jewel case with booklet, but we will work diligently to keep the cost to a minimum for you.

We appreciate everyone's input on this matter. Some was positive, some negative, some elegantly made an argument for their point, and some had a few blunt words, but all comments were heard and appreciated. Having spoken with many of you, I am happy that, if nothing else, this debate has sparked dinner table discussion about the environmental footprint that we all leave. Thank you for the opportunity to engage with you on this issue. We truly value you, your business, and your continued support.
